ANTI-SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING STATEMENT FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2020 ON BEHALF OF CHINA CONSTRUCTION BANK CORPORATION LONDON BRANCH ("CCBLB")

CCBLB is committed to implementing robust practices to combat slavery and human trafficking and will refuse to onboard or will seek to off-board a client, supplier or tenant where not satisfied that they are (i) meeting any company standards defined around modern slavery & human-trafficking, or (ii) taking adequate steps to address identified issues of modern slavery & human-trafficking occurring in its business or supply chains.

ORGANISATION STRUCTURE & BUSINESS: CCBLB is the UK establishment of China Construction Bank Corporation ("CCBC") and is part of CCBC's global banking group. CCBLB is a dual-regulated firm: authorized by the Prudential Regulation Authority and regulated by the Financial Conduct Authority and the Prudential Regulation Authority. Our business services cover the main areas of Corporate Banking & Financial Institutions, Treasury and RMB & GBP Clearing. We also act in the capacity of a landlord, leasing out parts of our premises to third parties ("Tenants").

OUR SUPPLY CHAINS: The full detail of our supply chains has been set out in previous years' statements available on our website which we do not repeat here as the detail has not changed. In summary, our supply chains broadly cover three areas: IT systems, people and premises. We tend to use mainly remote suppliers for IT systems and people, and where we use suppliers for our premises, this tends to be a mix of remotely provided and on-site services.

STEPS TAKEN: Our Anti-slavery Policy reflects our commitment to eliminating modern slavery and human-trafficking from our business and we are committed to acting ethically and with integrity in all our business dealings and relationships and to implementing and enforcing effective systems and controls to mitigate the risk of modern slavery or human-trafficking taking place anywhere in (a) our own business; or (b) in any of our supply chains. We regularly review our existing policies and procedures to identify appropriate modifications in order to identify and mitigate risk in our supply chains and business and these modifications have been introduced for our suppliers, tenants and new and existing clients. We have reviewed our induction and training requirements and introduced modem slavery and human-trafficking as a topic into our cycle of bankwide training. Our staff induction process also now includes a modem slavery element.

This statement has been approved by the Management Committee of CCBLB on 22 June 2021 and is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015.
